Excerpt from A Dissertation on the Sixth Book of Virgil's Aeneis Virgil found the epic poem in the first rank of human compositions; but this was too narrow a foundation for his enlarged ambition: He was not content that its subject should be to instruct the world in morals, much less did he think of physics, though he was fond of natural enquiries, and Homer's allegories had opened a back-door to let in the philosopher with the poet; but he aspired to make it a system of politics. On this plan he wrote the Aeneis; which is indeed as perfectly such, in verse, by example, as the Republics of Plato and Tully were in prose, by precept. Thus he added a new province to epic poesy. But though every one saw that Augustus was shadowed in the person of Aeneas, yet it being supposed that those political instructions, which the poet designed for the service of mankind, were for the sole use of his master, they missed of the true nature of the poem.
